INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF WALLIS LICENSING LIMITED

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Wallis Licensing Limited (the 'Company') for the year ended 31 March 2023, which comprise the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Changes in Equity and the related notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion the financial statements:

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an Auditor's Report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs (UK) will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

Irregularities, including fraud, are instances of non-compliance with laws and regulations. We design procedures in line with our responsibilities, outlined above, to detect material misstatements in respect of irregularities, including fraud. The extent to which our procedures are capable of detecting irregularities, including fraud is detailed below:

- Obtaining an understanding of the laws and regulations that are applicable to the Company, focusing on those laws and regulations that directly affect the financial statements, such as provisions of the UK Companies Act and tax legislation or that had a fundamental effect on the operations of the Company. We did not identify any laws and regulations which had a fundamental effect on the operations of the Company.

- We understood how the Company is complying with those legal and regulatory frameworks by making inquiries to management and those responsible for legal and compliance procedures.
- The engagement partner assessed whether the engagement team collectively had the appropriate competence and capabilities to identify or recognise non-compliance with laws and regulations. The assessment did not identify any issues in this area.
- We assessed the susceptibility of the Company's financial statements to material misstatement, including how fraud might occur.

Audit procedures performed by the engagement team included:

- identifying and assessing the design and effectiveness of controls management has in place to prevent and detect fraud; and
 - understanding how those charged with governance considered and addressed the potential for override of controls or other inappropriate influence over the financial reporting process.
- As a result of the above procedures, we considered the opportunities and incentives that may exist within the organisation for fraud and identified the greatest potential for fraud in the following area:
 - posting of unusual journals and complex transactions.

Because of the inherent limitations of an audit, there is a risk that we will not detect all irregularities, including those leading to a material misstatement in the financial statements or non-compliance with regulation. This risk increases the more that compliance with a law or regulation is removed from the events and transactions reflected in the financial statements, as we will be less likely to become aware of instances of non-compliance. The risk is also greater regarding irregularities occurring due to fraud rather than error, as fraud involves intentional concealment, forgery, collusion, omission or misrepresentation.

1. General information

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with section 1A of FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'.

Wallis Licensing Limited is a private company limited by shares, incorporated in England & Wales under the Companies Act 2006. The address of the registered office is given on the company information page.

There was no other income or expenditure for the company in the current or preceding year and so no Statement of Comprehensive income has been shown.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

2.2 Debtors

Short-term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2.3 Going concern

The company is part of a group and the ultimate parent company is Wockhardt Limited, a company listed on NSE in Mumbai, India. The company is reliant on other group entities for financial support to enable it to meet its liabilities, which solely relate to intercompany balances. The directors have concluded that the going concern basis is appropriate because the group will continue to provide support for the foreseeable future and the group has adequate resources to provide the necessary support required.
